[Updates to Title VI — The Election Statutes]

.01 **WHEREAS**, Statutes require constant updates and revisions to best serve the Student Body;
 .02 **WHEREAS**, The current Election Statutes can be found in Title VI; and
 .03 **WHEREAS**, This bill changes all uses of “business days” to “school days”;
 .04

.05 **THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED**, by the Forty-Ninth Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that
 .06 Title VI be amended as follows:


.08 Chapter 601.3

.09 J. Shall conduct at least five (5) informational sessions, at varying times,
 .10 including at least three (3) during Declaration of Candidacy and at least one
 .11 (1) after the completion of Declaration of Candidacy, to explain the Election
 .12 Statutes, relevant sections of the Golden Rule, and Title XI: Code of Ethics,
 .13 and to answer questions concerning the elections, for all candidates/tickets.
 .14 These informational sessions shall include information regarding what is and
 .15 is not appropriate campaign material, as per Student Body Statutes and the
 .16 Golden Rule. The Attorney General should be present if available. The five
 .17 (5) informational sessions’ dates and times must be posted on the SGA
 .18 website and in the SGA office no later than ten (10) ~~business school~~ days prior to the
 .19 first informational session. Furthermore, these dates must be announced
 .20 during the Senate meeting prior to the first informational session. Additional
 .21 informational sessions may be scheduled and posted on the SGA website as
 .22 needed.


.24 Should a filer wish to withdraw the affidavit, the filer may do so at any time prior to
 .25 the Election Commission Violation Hearing deliberation phase. The filer must
 .26 request to withdraw the affidavit in writing to the Supervisor of Elections. The
 .27 individual may not file a new affidavit regarding the same possible violation
 .28 following the withdrawal of the initial affidavit. Upon receipt of the written request
 .29 to withdraw the affidavit, the Supervisor shall inform the accused candidate/ticket
 .30 within one (1) ~~business school~~ day and immediately cancel or adjourn any scheduled
 .31 election violation hearing(s) related to the withdrawn affidavit.

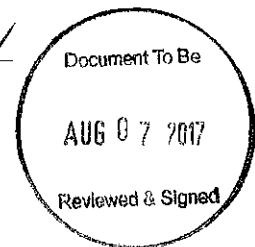
