
[Funding for American Society of Civil Engineers to host the Student Steel Bridge Competition at Knoxville, TN, on March 28]


- 1 **WHEREAS**, American Society of Civil Engineers has been a Registered Student Organization since 1972;  
2 **WHEREAS**, The mission of ASCE is to engage in building the foundation of tomorrow by advancing the spirit of  
3 professionalism and creativity among their members, by stimulating interest in civil engineering, by contributing to  
4 the needs of their community and society, and by encouraging students to become more involved as leaders.  
5 **WHEREAS**, ASCE members pay dues of \$20.00 annually, \$15 for Graduate Students, and \$15 for students  
6 graduating Fall 2018;  
7 **WHEREAS**, ASCE currently has 60 active members;  
8 **WHEREAS**, The purpose of the Student Steel Bridge Competition is to challenge students to extend their classroom  
9 knowledge to a practical and hands-on steel-design project that grows their interpersonal and professional skills,  
10 encourages innovation, and fosters impactful relationships between students and industry professionals; and  
11 **WHEREAS**, Students are challenged to an intercollegiate competition that supplements their education with a  
12 comprehensive, student-driven project experience from conception and design through fabrication, erection, and  
13 testing. The Student Steel Bridge Competition increases awareness of real world engineering issues such as spatial  
14 constraints, material properties, strength, serviceability, fabrication, erection processes, safety, aesthetics, project  
15 management, and cost. Success in competition requires application of engineering principles and theory, and  
16 effective teamwork;  
17 **WHEREAS**, American Society of Civil Engineers has received \$0.00 in Activity and Service Fee Funds in the  
18 2018- 2019 Fiscal Year;

20 **THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED**, by the Fifty-First Student Senate of the University of Central Florida that  
21 \$9,160.00 be allocated to American Society of Civil Engineers from the Senate Working Fund according to the  
22 following breakdown:

35 **BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That American Society of Civil Engineers completes a Post-Funding Form and  
36 returns it to the Operations Review and Sanctions Committee (ORS) by May 11, 2019, as a condition of receiving  
37 funding; and  
38 **BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That American Society of Civil Engineers completes a Verification of RSO  
39 Purchases Form by 1<sup>st</sup> of December, as a condition of receiving funding.
