
[Resolution in Favor of Increasing the Number of Exterior Water Fountains on Campus]

1 **WHEREAS**, Senate Rule 2.01(G) (2) states that the Student Body Advocacy (SBA) Committee is to be in constant review of
2 legislation at the national, state, and local level that affects the students at the University of Central Florida (UCF);
3 **WHEREAS**, Senate Rule 5.01 (B) (2) states that a Resolution pertains to every measure expressing the sentiment of the Student
4 Senate;
5 **WHEREAS**, Currently there are no readily accessible exterior water fountains on the UCF campus;
6 **WHEREAS**, Based on statistical evidence below, access to exterior water fountains by students attending the University of
7 Central Florida can increase the amount of water consumed, which can increase test scores and decrease anxiety levels on
8 campus;
9 **WHEREAS**, BBC reported East London and Westminster University study showing students with water on average scored 5%
10 higher than those without;
11 **WHEREAS**, The US National Library of Medicine/National Institutes of Health reports study showing increase in water
12 consumption leads to significant mood improvements; less fatigue, confusion, and sleepiness;
13 **WHEREAS**, The Center for Disease Control and Prevention reports that U.S. adults drink on average 39 ounces of water daily;
14 **WHEREAS**, The National Academies of Sciences Engineering Medicine states the approximate general recommendation of
15 water intake for women is 2.7 liters and men 3.7 liters daily;
16 **WHEREAS**, The Health Science Academy reports water being the most essential ingredient in preventing chronic disease;
17 **WHEREAS**, The newly installed exterior water fountains are to be placed in high trafficked areas such as, Memory Mall,
18 parking garages, and the Student Union;
19 **WHEREAS**, This Exterior Water Fountain Initiative is supported by the Josh and Jad administration and Executive Cabinet;
20 **WHEREAS**, The UCF Student Health Services mission is to “value and promote lifelong well-being to the UCF community”;
21 **WHEREAS**, The UCF Strategic Plan aims at solving society’s greatest challenges today; and
22 **WHEREAS**, The UCF Strategic Plan believes “if there’s a better way, we should do it”; thus, cooperating to promote our
23 students and society;

25 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That it is the opinion of the Fiftieth Student Body Senate of the University of Central
26 Florida that exterior water fountains be formatted into the UCF Strategic Plan and installed on campus to increase the quality of
27 life and experience of the students which we serve; and
